First, CONGRATULATIONS to Sister Verdelma "Dolly" Paine! She was one of four outstanding graduates of Kewaunee High School recently selected to the Kewaunee High School "Wall of Fame" and was honored at a banquet sponsored by the Build the Future Foundation on Sunday, April 14. Following is an excerpt of what appeared in the Kewaunee newspaper:

Verdelma "Dolly" Paine graduated from Kewaunee High School with the Class of 1949. While in high school, she was a member of the National Honor Society, the Kewaunatian, Student Council, Lake Whispers, served as an officer for the Drama and Library Clubs, and was also a cheerleader for football and basketball. She was the recipient of the VFW Award for Citizenship.

Dolly majored in business administration at the University of Wisconsin-Madison then returned to Kewaunee and began working as register in probate. She then served as court reporter for Kewaunee County and later for the state of Wisconsin, for 37 years.

Dolly was the first woman to serve as president of the Kewaunee School Board of Education, and was its longest-serving member at 27 years. She was a member of the Cooperative Educational Service Agency (CESA) Board of Control for 10 years and was also a member of the State Boundary Appeals Board in Madison for 10 years.

Dolly has served on the Kewaunee County Library Board for 10 years and the Kewaunee City Library Board for 12 years. She was a member of the Kewaunee Woman's Club for more than 20 years and has served as its president. She was also the president of Wisconsin Federation of Women's Clubs of the Eighth District for two years. She was a charter member of the Kewaunee County Business and Professional Woman's Club. Dolly was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star for over 50 years, holding numerous offices during that time. She also is an active member of the Kewaunee Rotary Club for the past 12 years and served as its president in 2012.

May you part upon the square.




