**The 2014 Steamboat Dinner again was a success.** Three hundred and sixty Holiday Tickets were purchased by Brothers, OES, friends and businesses in the community which were given to Social Services, LSCAP, and the Sunshine House for their distribution. Two hundred of these meals were delivered directly to the door step of these persons by volunteers in the community, none of which are Masons or OES members. Deliveries ranged throughout all of Door County except Washington Island. Next year's challenge might be to find a pilot that would deliver to Washington Island! The staff of Social Services who live in Northern Door County made 40 deliveries in that area. In addition, 187 meals were served from the drive thru on 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave, 373 meals were served in the dining room from 4 to 7p, and 52 workers ate. The Total meals served were 812. 


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
