It is not too early to be thinking about the **Steamboat Dinner on March 12, 2016. Holiday Tickets** will again be available in early December. Last year 360 such tickets were purchased by Brothers and Friends of the lodge for distribution to Social Services, LSCAP, and the Sunshine House. For shut-ins, and those that do not drive, meals are delivered directly to their door step. Since 1992 over 5,600 meals have helped to feed the needy in Door County.

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The lodge has installed 2 **Carbon Monoxide detectors**. One in the SW corner of the dining room and one upstairs in the lodge/chapter room in the masonic west. We already have the required fire alarm system in place which is checked quarterly and inspected by the fire department.

Redecorating of the dining area will soon begin and hopefully be completed by the Steamboat Dinner. This will include new ceiling tiles, cleaning the padded chair seats, painting, and setting up a pictorial area devoted to our work in the community.

With the Thanksgiving holiday coming up, I thought I would share a Cranberry sauce recipe which I have made each year for over 15 years. I use this at home as well as share it with my Pine Crest Family as well. It has been I hope you enjoy.

Cranberry Sauce

4 medium apples, cored, and
3 oranges, cut in 8 pieces
1 12-ounce package Fresh or Frozen Cranberries
1 cup sugar
½ cup sweet vermouth

1. Assemble the ingredients
2. Dust off the hand grinder and attach to the counter
3. Gather your kids/grandkids, this is highly beneficial in producing the sauce
4. Start grinding ingredients into a large bowl. Tell kids how fun it is.
5. Have them turn the handle.
6. After 1st three ingredients are ground add sugar and wine
7. Cover and let sit overnight to blend flavors.
8. Enjoy with friends and family

The most important direction given here, I believe, is to have children helping. Not just for the obvious reason of having them do the work (wink wink), but also that one can enjoy a tradition and keep it alive for generations to come.
